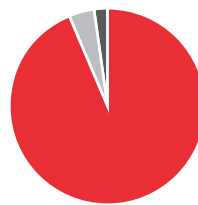

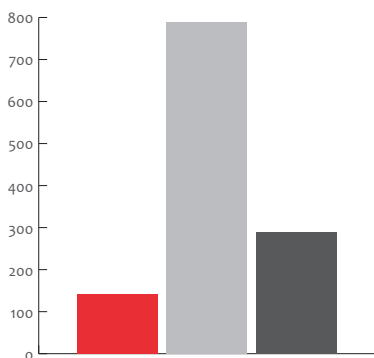
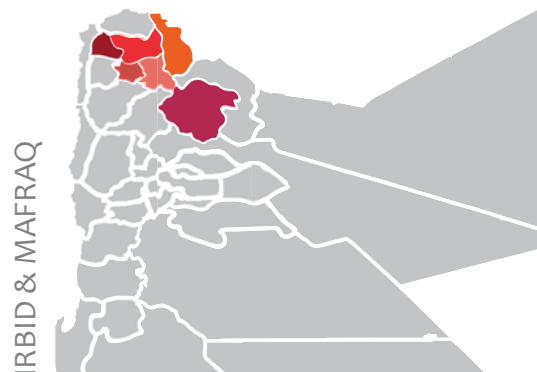

2041 Jordanians and 448 Syrians

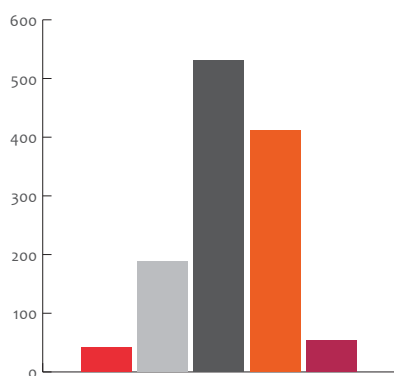
Area

The program is implemented in 165 local neighborhoods/villages in Mafraq and Irbid



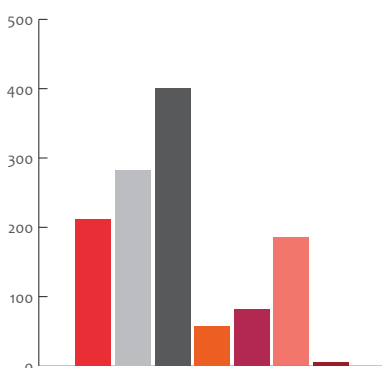

Participants' feedback

At the end of the year-long Ana Usharek Mujtam3i program, we asked the participants for their feedback.

1237 Community members completed the survey; 1025 Jordanians (83%) and 212 Syrians (17%), 496 males (40%) and 741 females (60%).

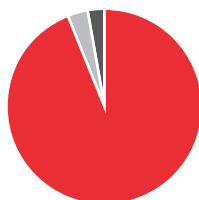

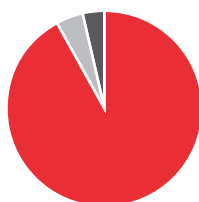

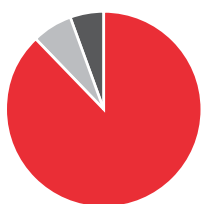

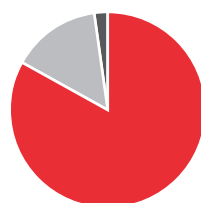
